What will I know at the end of the unit?


- To compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive stating examples of each.

Key words	Definitions
Living	Something that can move, grow, have babies and needs air and water.
Dead	Something that was once living or part of a living thing.
Alive	Something that can move, grow, have babies and needs air and water.
Never alive	Something that has never been living.
Habitat	The natural home or environment of an animal or plant.
Microhabitat	A small habitat within a larger habitat.
