
This is how we teach the **Fundamental British Values** in Nursery

Individual Liberty

- Children are taught to become more independent and take personal responsibility
- ✓ 'Lines of Enquiry' (following the children's interests)

- ✓ Encouraging children to make choices to direct their own learning and play a role in the Characteristics of Effective Learning
- ✓ Participation in class performances and Christmas Production
- ✓ CoEL- children are encouraged to ask questions and trust that opinions and ideas will be respected and valued
- ✓ Being responsible for own health and wellbeing e.g. road-safety discussions and personal hygiene

Democracy
