Mutual Respect

- ✓ Through the PSHE curriculum children learn about 'Health and Wellbeing,' 'Relationships', 'Living in the Wider World'
- ✓ PSHE-'What makes a good friend?' topic in Autumn
- ✓ Thread throughout the whole curriculum e.g. World Book Day-authors from different ethnicities, backgrounds, Remembrance Day
- ✓ RE – learning about others' religions, beliefs, values and seeing similarities between faiths (Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism)
- ✓ Weekly Pride and Golden Assemblies
- ✓ Class Promises
- ✓ Respecting the different beliefs of others
- ✓ A range of group arrangements within lessons-mixed ability pairing/trios/groupings to encourage children to learn from each other and to be mentors.

Individual Liberty

- ✓ Children are taught to become increasingly independent and responsible for themselves and their belongings
- ✓ Participation in class performances, assemblies and Christmas Production
- ✓ Being responsible for own health and wellbeing e.g. road-safety, personal hygiene, 'What helps us to stay safe?' unit in PSHE
- ✓ Encouragement of their right to question and learn about opinions of themselves and others
- ✓ Library visits where children choose their own book
- ✓ Extra-curricular activities e.g. Sports clubs
- ✓ Picture News assemblies
- ✓ Peer Buddies- voting system
- ✓ Make own choice for lunch in the school dinner hall

Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs

- ✓ RE provides a broad and balanced curriculum exploring different faiths, religions and cultures (Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism)
- ✓ Religious Celebrations-Eid, Christmas, Easter, Divali, Lunar New Year are recognised and celebrated
