Mutual Respect

- ✓ Thread throughout the whole curriculum e.g., Guided Reading sessions have some links with PSHE and RE; PE – learning about 'sportsmanship', RE-learning about others religion- Islam, Hinduism, Sikhism Christianity,
- ✓ Through the PSHE curriculum children learn about Anti-Bullying Week, Health & Wellbeing and Online safety
- ✓ A variety of group arrangements within lessons: mixed ability pairing/trios/groupings encourage children to learn from each other and to be mentors.

Individual Liberty

- ✓ Take responsibility for our own safety and wellbeing; e.g. keeping safe (online safety, road safety), physical and emotional health (PSHE, Science, hydration assembly)
- ✓ Roles within the classroom e.g. monitors
- ✓ School dinner choice
- ✓ Library visits where children choose their own book
- ✓ Teachers allow pupils to have choice within some areas of the curriculum e.g. class novel, PSHE discussions,
- ✓ Extra curricular activities e.g. Sports clubs, Commando Joe's,

Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs

- ✓ RE provides a broad and balanced curriculum exploring different faiths, religions and cultures. (Hinduism, Islam, Christianity, Sikhism)
- ✓ Religious Celebrations-Eid, Christmas and Easter, Diwali, Lunar New Year are recognised as part of the curriculum.
