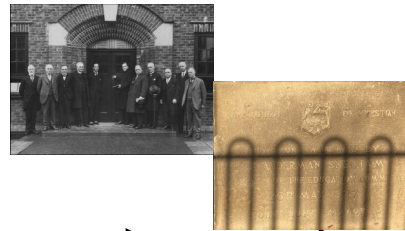
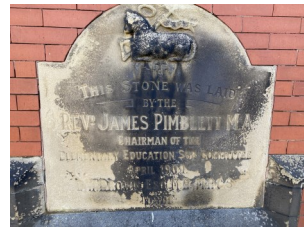


# Deepdale Community Primary School - History Knowledge Organiser

The first map is from 1891 and shows how Preston North End Football Ground is there but that our school is not. In 1891 there was a farm where school is now.

Preston North End Football Ground is on both maps.

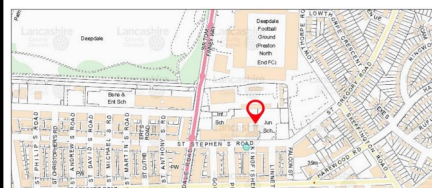
Our school is not on the old map. The map shows there was a farm where the school is now.

### What were classrooms like in the past?



Most classrooms had a map of the British Empire and portraits of King George 5th and Queen Mary.



School children sat on benches behind wooden desks. Sometimes, 5 children had to squeeze onto a bench made for 2.

Classrooms were big and had no carpet. There was one fire at the front near the teacher.



### What equipment did they have?



Lessons were written on a board for children to copy out.

Children wrote on dark slate with a chalky pencil. Older children used metal nibbed pens ink wells.



### What punishments did they have?



Children had to write lines on the blackboard.

Some children had to wear a cap.
