English

Reading

Events beyond Living Memory The Great Fire of London

We are learning...

- that the fire started on the 2nd September 1666 and lasted until Thursday 6th September 1666.
- that the fire spread quickly because;
 - the buildings were close together.
 - the buildings were made of wood.
 - it was windy so the fire burned faster.
- people buried things to protect them.
- Samuel Pepys wrote about events in his diary. This is a primary source.
- the City of London was redesigned in a safer way
 - streets became wider.
 - buildings had to be made of bricks.

- Jewish people believe in one God.
- Jewish people believe God flooded the Earth and told Noah to build an Ark to save his family and animals of the world.
- Jewish people believe that a rainbow appeared as a sign of God's promise.
