Key words	Definitions
bark	Outside layer of stems on woody plants.
bud	A small, compact start of a new leaf, flower or shoot.
shoot	A new plant growing from a seed or bulb.
deciduous	Plants that lose their leaves each year.
evergreen	Plants that keep their leaves throughout the year.
blade	A long flat or cylindrical leaf.
trunk	The stem of a tree.
