


Deforestation:

What is it doing to our world?

Deforestation is destroying the habitats of many animals leading to their death and possible extinction.

Deforestation is one reason for global warming, which is having a devastating impact on our planet –flooding, shrinking sea ice, changing seasons and rising sea levels.



- The Amazon, located in Brazil, is the world's largest tropical rainforest.
- The Amazon rainforest is inhabited by plants, animals and humans.
- We get many items of food such as coffee, bananas, black pepper and cocoa (beans used to make chocolate) from the Amazon rainforest.

DANGER: big businesses and farming are changing the nature of the rainforest and the local populations. The sheer size of the rainforest means that what is happening is having an effect upon the rest of the world.
