Archaeologist	A person who studies history by digging up objects and using them to tell us about the past

Sutton Hoo

- Sutton Hoo is the site of two Anglo-Saxon cemeteries dating from the 6th to 7th centuries near Woodbridge, Suffolk, England.
- Archaeologists have been excavating the area since 1938, when a previously undisturbed ship burial containing a wealth of Anglo-Saxon artefacts was discovered.
- The site was first excavated by Basil Brown.
- The **Sutton Hoo helmet** is a decorated Anglo-Saxon helmet found during a 1939 excavation of the Sutton Hoo ship-burial.
