Name of Parable	Bible Reference	The Moral
The Parable of the Good Samaritan	Luke 10:25-37	Love those who may not be our friend.
The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant	Matthew 18:21-35	Show forgiveness to others as Jesus forgave them.

The bible is split into two books; The Old Testament and New Testament.



The New Testament is split into four Gospels; Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

Commandment, gospel, neighbour

The first commandment is based on love. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and soul and with all your mind."

Christian love is known as agape. It is selfless.



Christian Aid is a charity that aims to create a world where everybody can be free from poverty.

The second commandment is similar. "Love your neighbour as yourself."
