<u>Home Reading</u>

Read every day with your child and sign their planner.

Helping your child at home.

Communication and Language

- Encourage your child to have lots of conversations with other children and adults.
- Play sensory games with your child as you are walking to school
 What can you see? What can you hear?
- Play games with your child where they listen to instructions.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Encourage you child to talk about how they are feeling.
- Encourage your child to play with others and take turns.
- Encourage your child to get dressed by themselves in the morning.

Physical Development

- Provide regular opportunities where your child can move energetically such as running, jumping etc.
- Provide lots of opportunities to use pens and pencils to develop their grip and control.

<u>Mathematics</u>

- Ask your child to count out a number of things from a group, e.g. "Could you get me three eggs."
- Make patterns with objects, e.g. buttons or shells. Such as 'big, small, big....' or 'red, blue, red...'

<u>Literacy</u>

- Read with your child everyday. You may wish to join the local library.
- Play games where you give your child an instruction like " Can you h-o-p?" Your child has to put the sounds of the words together.

Understanding the World

- Talk about the lives of the people in your family.
- Talk about changes in the seasons with your child.
- When cooking with your child, talk about the changes taking place.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Sing a range of well known nursery rhymes.
- Cut, stick, glue and paint with your child.
- Make up stories with your child.



Phonics is at the heart of the Reception curriculum. Children learn to read using their phonics skills, not the alphabet.

Phonics

Children will learn the sound (phoneme) for each written letter (grapheme) and develop their blending (putting sounds together to read the words) and segmenting skills.

At the start of the year...

children will bring home a Lilac reading book that will contain pictures.



Please share the book alongside your child and talk about the characters you can see and the events that are happening.

Once ready...

children will bring home a Phase 2 reading book that will contain both words and



As the year progresses, the children will read more challenging books.

By the end of the year, we expect the children to be reading Phase 3 books independently.



In Reception the children use a range of exciting, ambitious texts in order to learn to write words, captions and sentences. Here are some examples











By the end of the year, we expect children to write simple, well-punctuated sentences with all letters formed correctly. All sentences should be readable by others.
