
Home Learning

'Hit the Button' is an online game that will help the children remember number bonds, doubles and halves.





If you are not signed up to **Class Dojo** please take your mobile to the school office and they will offer help. There is lots of important information sent this way.

The teacher will add a message to **Class Dojo** every week to outline the learning for the week.

Reading 3x weekly and accessing 'Numbots' and 'Hit the Button' is the children's Y1 homework.

In Autumn Term 2, the children will also take home weekly spellings.

These are to be practiced at home and at the end of the week there will be a spelling check.

Please do not allow the children to practice their spellings in the school book.

Phonics/Reading

Phonics is at the heart of the Year 1 curriculum.

Children learn to read using their phonics skills, not the alphabet.





In Year 1 the daily phonics lessons help to support the children in reading books that are closely matched to their phonic ability.





The children will explore the meaning of unfamiliar words - **grinned.**

What do you think the word grinned might mean?



Writing


In Year 1 the children use a range of exciting, ambitious texts in order to write a range of interesting sentences.

At Deepdale we block Maths topics across the year.


Number - Place Value, Addition and Subtraction, Multiplication and Division and Fractions.

Addition


Add one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20.



Multiplication


Solve multiplication problems using practical equipment and jottings.

Subtraction


Subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20.
