


Walking Home: Reminder



Homework will be set on Purple Mash. Click on the link and the PDF will open containing your weekly homework



Children may be set weekly tasks in:

Maths: in most cases this will reinforce what the children have been learning in Maths that week.

Spellings: the children will have a list of spellings that they are expected to learn how to spell by heart and understand the meaning of.

English: this is likely to be a grammar task linked to the learning that week.

Reading: as well as reading their home reading book EVERYDAY, the children will be set reading activities on Purple Mash.

Handwriting: handwriting practice sheets will be sent home if required.

Teachers may also use ClassDojo to share homework.

Please use ClassDojo as a means of communicating with your class teacher about home learning.

All children will bring home a blue homework book to complete their tasks.



Homework will be set on a Friday and handed in the following Wednesday.

- Please sign this to indicate that you have read with them that evening.



On the school website you will find what is expected of a Year 5 writer. Below is an example of the standard expected:




Expectations:



There is lots to support your child with their learning including:


- A yearly overview of all the content we will be teaching your children.
