#### Why celebrate our differences?

We see this as being a true strength of the school that allows us to learn about the wider world. This fantastic opportunity allows us to see 'life beyond Deepdale' and will drive the PSHE aspect of our curriculum, which includes how we exhibit spiritual, moral, social and cultural understanding. We endeavour to become a 'Rights Respecting School' and our expectation is that every individual appreciates the core British Values that also guide us towards living a fulfilling and adventurous life.

Across the curriculum, we will seize opportunities to identify our talents and share our strengths. Through our planned work with external agencies alongside the wider curriculum, we are particularly able to further target children with more specific barriers to learning. Working creatively through the wider curriculum enables us to engage more fully with parents and carers, allowing them to share in the success of their children's work and wider experiences. Feedback from Deepdale children informs us that they learn best when lessons are taught alongside opportunities to investigate, explore and enjoy – so this is what we do!

#### Why do we strive to be healthy?

In a world where technological advances are a force to be reckoned with and fast food is available at every corner, we must ensure that Deepdale pupils have the required knowledge and understanding to become healthy, mindful individuals. We will continue to excel in our sporting prowess. Our curriculum offer will continue to ensure that children have access to extra-curricular activities that develop both their physical strength and self-esteem. The curriculum will tackle current affairs related to online safeguarding, emotional wellbeing and balanced diets in a variety of formats ranging from cookery to learning positive mindset techniques. Deepdale pupils will develop healthy habits that will enable them to make positive decisions within a community where challenges are present.

With a high proportion of children speaking English as an additional language, vocabulary is naturally high on the agenda at Deepdale Community Primary School. <u>Vocabulary can be seen everywhere</u>! We recognise that children enter school with language and communication concerns from a young age yet, they consistently build and build upon a rich vocabulary to be proud of. We support parents in helping to develop children's basic skills at home, through a close Parent Partnership that delivers workshops and access to local and national resources. The whole curriculum has a great emphasis on speaking and listening opportunities through cross-curricular reading and presentation skills. We provide additional support to those children who are New to English. Tier 2 words are identified across every subject strand.
