

In March 2020 all schools were instructed to close following the outbreak of the Coronavirus Pandemic. Schools did not re-open fully until September 2020 resulting in pupils missing 5 months of face to face learning. Schools have been allocated £80 per pupil (£14,000 for Delph Side) which will be put into the school budget at three times during the academic year. Starting with an initial payment of £3500 in the Autumn Term. At the end of September 2020, all Pupils underwent baseline assessments to establish exactly where they were working in line with the previous year groups curriculum and their current year expectations. Below is an overview of the schools identified priorities and allocated spending.

Current Situation

- Pupils are working behind where they would be expected to in the core subjects of reading, writing and maths.
- 70% of Year 1 pupils targeted to pass the phonics screening check in the summer term
- 45% of Year 2 pupils were on track to pass the phonics screening assessment in September 2020 70% of Year 2 pupils targeted to pass November 2020 – 90% Targeted to pass by July 2021 (equivalent to passing at the end of Year 2)
- 25% of year 6 pupils on track for reading September 2020, 57% targeted for ARE by the end
 of the year
- 7% of year 6 pupils on track for writing September 2020, 53% targeted for ARE by the end
 of the year
- 25% of year 6 pupils on track for maths September 2020, 53.5% targeted for ARE by the end
 of the year
- 35% of year 2 pupils on track for reading September 2020, 55% targeted for ARE by the end
 of the year
- 10% of year 2 pupils on track for writing September 2020, 50% targeted for ARE by the end of the year
- 45% of year 2 pupils on track for maths September 2020, 65% targeted for ARE by the end of the year

- A number of pupils returning with low confidence and self-esteem
