
Please can you ensure that your child/children do not bring these into school. If they wish to have deodorants with them then a roll-on version is fine.

We are pleased to announce that we will be introducing our own school dog and will be joining The Dog Mentor Programme. The Dog Mentor programme has built upon the benefits of the human-animal bond by providing children positive experiences with dogs that can help them educationally, developmentally, emotionally and socially.

Over the last nine years The Dog Mentor programme has been proven to have a positive impact on children in all areas including self-esteem, behaviour, peer relationships and better engagement skills. These improvements then result in improved academic achievement.

Mr Coucill will be bringing his dog Daisy into school from Thursday 21 September. We envisage that The Dog Mentor Programme will bring a positive influence into the school environment as a whole and look forward to the impact The Dog Mentor programme will have on our children. Full training will be given to both Daisy and our staff that will work with Daisy in order to ensure that the welfare of everyone involved is maintained as a top priority. Daisy will initially only



be in school for one morning a week to continue with her training with key staff. Over time, she will be in school for longer periods and more days. Daisy will have her own schedule and planned activities with certain students/areas in school. It is not the case that she will be able to roam freely around school or that students will be able to see her on demand. This is part of the dog mentor programme and helps to ensure her work is targeted correctly and reduces stress and anxiety for her and all students.










Wizard of Oz Auditions

To facilitate efficient communication and maintain the high standards of education and safeguarding in school, we kindly request your cooperation in the following matters:

- 1. **Appointment Scheduling**: Please be aware that same day appointments with staff members are generally not available unless made in advance. This is to ensure that our teachers and support staff can effectively manage their timetables and continue to provide a high level of support to our students in school.
- 2. **Response Time**: When contacting school staff, we ask that you allow up to 48 hours for a response, except in cases of urgent safeguarding matters. Your patience in this is greatly appreciated, as it allows our staff to prioritize their responsibilities effectively.
- 3. Contacting Teachers or Pastoral Year Leads / Heads of Year: The best way to get in touch with a teacher or your child's Pastoral Year Lead or Head of Year is to send an e-mail to info@derbycathedralschool.org.uk and put in the subject of the e-mail "FAO (Name of person you want to speak with)". Our Reception team will ensure that your message is promptly forwarded to the correct person.

If you have any urgent concerns or safeguarding matters, please do not hesitate to contact us immediately and we will respond appropriately.
