Reading Buddies

Being a fluent reader is such an important skill. We can all see how much it is needed in our everyday lives but there are other important aspects that may not be as widely known. Reading is also good for you because it improves your focus, memory, empathy, and communication skills. It can reduce stress, improve your mental health, and help you live longer.

Reading also helps us to learn new things that help us succeed at work and in our relationships with others. We want all of these things for our students and so have a number of strategies in place to promote reading for pleasure and help to improve students reading skills.

As part of this, we have a reading buddy scheme. This is where some of our older students support the younger years with their reading. Once a week, a large groups of year 9 and 10 students pair up with their reading buddy in year 7 or 8. Year 9's are paired with year 7 and year 10 with year 8. This is because research shows that peer mentoring of this sort works best with a two year gap.

It is brilliant to see them all work together in the mornings in our LRC. Not only will this help to improve their reading but it also aids our strong sense of community and builds relationships between the year groups. A huge thank you goes to Mrs Lynch and Mrs McCrory for their organisation with this and of course, to our students for their willingness, support and participation.

It's also makes a huge difference if students read at home too. This doesn't have to always be a book: recipes, instructions, news etc. are all good sources of reading material.
