We also hope that our students will enjoy the experience of watching a big national event together. We are also providing other activities for those who do not wish to watch it.

Pupil premium is a government initiative that supports students who have been entitled to free school meals in the past 6 years. Schools are able to decide how to best support this group of students with the aim of improving their educational outcomes. One of our strategies is to provide additional support and mentoring.

Mrs Boyle is our teaching assistant who supports a group of students but is often there for anyone who needs her – she is a very popular lady! Mrs Boyle supports students in their lessons and runs mentoring sessions to help with personal organisation, increasing aspiration and helping with any issues that may be a barrier for students to learn in the best way possible. She is extremely creative and makes various websites and competitions so that students can access support at any time. You can see one of her amazing displays in the photo!

Mr Emberley (Assistant Headteacher) is responsible for overseeing Pupil Premium; this is an area that schools have to report on every year. He makes decisions about how we best support students and how effective this support is. He also looks at the wider support on



offer such as ensuring trips and activities are more affordable and that our students are entering into the full life of the school e.g. attending extra-curricular activities.
