# Election fever hits Derby school as it holds mock general election for the first time!



## Malaga Trip 2024

A huge thank you to the staff and students who made this such a successful trip. All were able to enjoy the Spanish culture, climate and food!

Here are some photos from their week and a great description of their time away.

At 4am on Monday the 1st of July, 44 students from Years 9, 10, 11 and 12 set off for a 4 day stay in the beautiful province of Málaga on Spain's Costa del Sol.

The students coped admirably well with the early start and their enthusiasm was contagious.

We arrived at our hotel and headed straight for the beach, where students enjoyed a swim and some relaxation in 34 degree sunshine. Students got straight to work practicing their Spanish, ordering cool drinks and ice-creams!

Day 2 saw us start out with a scavenger hunt around the paseo marítimo of Torremolinos. Then we hopped on a coach to the Maravillas language shcool, where we were given a Spanish language demonstration of how to make a giant Paella. Students learned all about the origins of the dish, and how it got its name. They were also very happy to take part in the cooking and stirring. After everyone had sampled the mouthwatering Paella, students went off into classrooms for Spanish lessons and the teachers at the school gave really positive feedback about participation and enthusiasm.

Day 3 (Mr Saunders' birthday) was another full and fun-packed day with another beach trip. Then a tapas tasting experience where students sampled Albondigas, Calamares, Patatas Bravas and Pa amb oli.

A quick dip in the pool was followed by a visit to a performance of Traditional Flamenco dance and music, giving students a first-hand experience of an art form, which is culturally very important to Spain and has been around since at least the 17th century. Students loved the show, and a couple of them (who shall remain anonymous) even gave us a very convincing, impromptu performance of their Flamenco skills whilst waiting to board the plane for our return journey!

Day 4 was our final day and the group headed out to Málaga city for a look at the Alcazaba, a fortification built in the 11th Century. Took in spectacular panoramic views of the city and its bullring, visited the old Roman theatre and the shops. We also headed to the Pablo Picasso museum to look at some of his artwork, it split opinion, but all agreed that as a cultural experience, they were glad they went. We just had time for one more ice-cream before we said farewell to the beautiful Spanish Coast.

Whilst on the trip, I had comments from many different people of different nationalities, telling me how polite and well behaved our students were. The final one being a lady on the plane back to East Midlands who specifically came to find me and told me that the students were a credit to us.

All of the teaching staff who accompanied the students were so impressed with the way they handled being away from home, how they all attempted to use the language, and how respectful they were of the cultures, traditions and people.

We also loved the conversations, games and laughter we shared with our students, who might have persuaded me to run another trip. Watch this space!



## **NHS Cadets Opportunity**

St. John's Ambulance and the NHS have partnered up to offer an exciting free programme called the NHS Cadets.

NHS Cadets' mission is to attract young people to careers in healthcare and develop their skills to the point where they are self-sufficient in health volunteer opportunities.

The programme will assist young people in not only acquiring new skills and knowledge but also gaining hands-on experience in the NHS through a 36-week programme (2 hours per week, not including work experience).

There is currently an Advanced Programme starting soon in Derby aimed at 16-18 year olds.



## Reach your potential with NHS Cadets and learn the skills you need to support vital healthcare teams across the country.

NHS Cadets is a Programme created by St John Ambulance in partnership with the NHS. It's designed to provide you with the opportunity to explore roles in healthcare and prepare for volunteering.

The programme consists of two pathways: Foundation (for 14–16-year-olds) and Advanced (for 16–18-year-olds). You'll learn about a range of exciting healthcare topics, develop your leadership and communication skills, and gain insight into volunteering within the NHS

It is a free programme consisting of 2-hour weekly sessions over 36 weeks. You'll be supported throughout your journey by our NHS Cadets Team.

#### Who can get involved?

Our Cadets come from a diverse range of backgrounds - there is no 'typical' NHS Cadet. If you identify with one or more of these statements, our programme would be a good match for you.

- · I'm from a minority ethnic group
- I consider myself part of the LGBTQI+ community, or I'm questioning
- I'm not in education, employment or training, or I'm at risk of this
- · I'm struggling with my progress at school or college
- I live in care, or I've recently left care
- · I provide regular care or support for someone
- I receive free school meals
- · I have mental health concerns
- · I consider myself to have a disability or impairment
- I consider myself neurodivergent, or I have special educational needs
- · I am seeking asylum, or I'm a refugee

# **Scooter Safety**

We have recently been informed of at least five students who have had injuries due to riding an electric scooter. Some of these injuries have been very serious and required ongoing medical attention and significant amount of time off school.

Please be aware that the use of private e-scooters is still illegal. The government information is as follows and can be found here: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/e-scooter-trials-guidance-for-users

The <u>rules for private e-scooters</u> have not changed. It is against the law to use a privately owned e-scooter. If you use an e-scooter illegally:

- you could face a fine
- you could get penalty points on your licence
- the e-scooter could be impounded

This information shows that whilst the government are trialling e-scooters for hire in various cities, these require a driving licence and are not for children.

e-scooters are not allowed to be brought to school as they are illegal. We are also concerned about the number of our students who have received significant injuries from using these.

Please do ensure that your children are not using theses for transport at any time.

## **National Saturday Club**


NSC (National Saturday Club) is a free group that runs every Saturday for students ages 13 – 16.
