### A Level and GCSE Artist Workshop

On 15 September our A Level and GCSE art students were incredibly fortunate to participate in a workshop with a visiting artist.

Ian Murphy is a contemporary fine artist from Wigan who is best known for his powerful, atmospheric, mixed media oil paintings of architectural places.

He spent a full day with our students and provided a drawing and mixed media workshop with all Year 12 students. Some of our GCSE Year 11 students spent some time with him as well.

Students learnt about his work, techniques and processes used. They produced 5 pieces of work using graphite, fine liner, mixed media, ink, paint and collage.

## **Cathedral Visit for Sixth Form Musicians**

On Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> September, Mrs Eaton took the Music Sixth Form students for a visit to Derby Cathedral. Students were shown how the organ works and demonstrated how to use the stops and other functions. Mr Binns (Director of Music at the Cathedral) also showed students the choir room where Derby Cathedral choristers practice.

Mr Binns also explained the history of the Cathedral and explained how the organ was introduced to the Cathedral in 1939. Students were shocked to hear that the organ would cost two million pounds to replace!



### **Year 10 Kedleston Hall Visit**

As part of our ongoing partnership with the National Trust, Mr Adler (History) and Miss Rowley (Careers) took a group of Year 10 students to our closest National Trust property, Kedleston Hall. The group was kindly assisted by Mr Capon and Miss Maddocks.

The students were blown away by the size of the hall and grounds and were amazed to discover that although the property was almost 300 years old, it was built as the ultimate party pad! Despite the hall only being 15 minutes from school, for most of the group, this was the first time they had visited. The house is closed to the general public on Wednesdays but we were very fortunate to be given a behind-the-scenes tour by Katherine who is the head of the hall's conservation team. As a result we were able to see, feel and smell some of the furniture and artefacts that the general public don't usually get to see. We were also able to discovered what was hidden behind some of the hall's secret doors and have a private tour of the museum.

Katherine then gave us a fascinating talk on her job and why she loves it so much and the volunteer guides, Tina and Julia, explained why they love volunteering for the National Trust and helping visitors get the most from their visit to Kedleston which certainly inspired many of our students. Since returning to school, we have received a lovely email from Lyndsey at the hall praising our students on their enthusiasm, engagement and behaviour.

We are looking to further enhance our partnership with Kedleston Hall and the National Trust so watch this space for more exciting developments. ## **Next Steps for Year 11**

On Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> September, parents and carers visited the school for our second annual Year 11 Information evening. As well as learning about the upcoming GCSE exams, revision techniques and how to support their child with workload and wellbeing, parents also received some information on Post-16 options and next steps.

Soon it will be time for students in Year 11 to start making a decision about what they want to do after their GCSE exams. By law, all young people must stay in some form of education or training until the age of 18. This could include:

- Sixth Form (either here at Derby Cathedral School or at another school)
- College
- Apprenticeships
- Traineeships

Living in Derby, we're lucky to have 11 schools with Sixth Forms within the city, and a large Further Education college with 3 campuses. As well as this, lots of our well-known employers in the area such as Rolls-Royce and Toyota offer excellent apprenticeship opportunities, and there are also specialist training providers such as the Derby County Football & Education Programme and the White Rose beauty colleges.

It's important that students make a well-informed decision that is right for them, so we have a few things planned in school over the new few months that will help with this decision-making process.

We're excited to announce that on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> November, we will be hosting opportunity for students to hear from some outside providers in school. Students will also have a series of PSHE lessons all around exploring and applying for Post-16 options.

In addition to this, the latest list of Open Days in our area has been communicated to Year 11 parents via email. Students can book 1-1 careers appointments with Miss Rowley if they are needing support getting started with their Post-16 decisions.

Our Sixth Form open evening is on Thursday 12 October at 5.30pm.
