For us at DCS the quote from Colossians shows us how displaying good qualities is like choosing to put on the right clothes. So, let us choose to "put on" kindness, humility, compassion, patience and love.

Dear Parents/Carers,

We had a fabulous finale to the end of last week with a social action event provided by Year 10!

We know that times are not always easy for families currently and so it's even more impressive seeing our students spend time and energy thinking of others. As a year group they have identified Cancer Research as their chosen charity. The students had to devise their own ways to fundraise. It was a great sign of our FAITH value: Fellowship, that they pooled their resources together and decided to put on a fundraising fair over lunchtimes for the rest of the school. All students have also been greatly inspired by Mrs Young's pledge to shave her head if they raise £1500. There are lots of pictures of some of the activities provided by each Year 10 tutor group. I would like to say a huge thank you to all students along with their tutors, Mr Blackwood and Miss Nicholson. They have worked together in such a positive way in order to reach out and help others who have a really difficult experience in life. It's great to see our FAITH values in action.

At the end of the day on Friday, Mrs Young demonstrated Fellowship in abundance as part of her fundraising head shave for Cancer research. We are all in awe of her bravery and sacrifice. Not only did she inspire our community to raise a large sum of money but she underwent the head shave in front of the whole of year 10! They were incredibly supportive to her and we're all extremely proud of everyone involved in this venture for showing their Fellowship towards others.

Our Bible verse for last week talks about how we show compassion, kindness and humility to others. As you will be aware, humility is one of our FAITH values and we encourage students to think of ways that they can show FAITH values as part of their everyday lives. Humility can be a harder FAITH value to demonstrate. Our corridor display gives the following quotes written by students and staff:

We all make mistakes and should own up to them and say sorry. Forgiving others for their mistakes is also important. Don't bear grudges and be slow to anger but rich in love.

People should be given a fresh start. If we all show forgiveness it helps everyone to move from their mistakes. We should all feel welcome and given a second chance.

One of the ways we demonstrate this in school is by holding restorative conversations after times of conflict or dispute. This teaches our students a really important skill of being able to apologise, to forgive and to move on. Restoring relationships is helpful for all of us and especially for our students as part of their journey into their adult working lives so that they are able to build and maintain healthy relationships with all those they interact with. As the verse suggests, we are able to 'put on' these values. That means we do have a choice about how and when to demonstrate these values. With our focus on FAITH in action, we hope that these values become normal everyday actions for all of our students.


