Dear Parents/Carers,

Our week started with an INSET day this week. These days are very busy ones for the staff in school. We use these days to ensure that our staff workforce keep receiving all of the training and support they need to do their job as effectively as possible.

Our themes, for the teaching staff, this year were: Talking for learning Year 11 exam preparation

Talking for learning is an important strategy to help our students continue to improve their literacy. Being able to speak clearly and present your thoughts and ideas well to others is a critical life skill.

As part of our continued focus on literacy (reading and speaking), we are planning a few simple initiatives in all classrooms. All staff are developing a literacy focused wall display that highlights some of the key 'command' words for each subject. For example, the word 'describe' is often used in many subjects and all students need to understand how to answer a question that starts with the word 'describe'. Each subject has a set of these words and staff are working on how we display these and weave them into every lesson.

We are also starting a 'word of the week' for all students. This week was 'controversy' – please see the article below which gives the meaning of this word and some tips for how to speak to your children about it at home.

We also have a continued focus with year 11 at this time of the year. Staff have planned various intervention sessions and 'warm ups', which are short activities that we use immediately before each final exam. They are designed to 'warm up' their brains and help them to remember the structure of the exam paper so they know how to manage their time during the exam. We also do a vital equipment check during this time.

Our pastoral team also spent some time on some interactive training related to supporting students who are experiencing mental health problems. They also had a refresher session on how to create and review relevant risk assessments.

We're really grateful to all staff for being the dedicated team that they are and how focused and supportive they are, especially so during this training day.

Just as a reminder, this Tuesday is parents evening for all year 10 students. We look forward to seeing you all in school with your child. This is such an important year for them and their learning and all of their teachers are looking forward to sharing how we can work well together to best support them.

Word of the Week

There is **controversy** surrounding the team's decision to trade the star player.

The **controversy** is over whether he should be fired or not.

Year 12 EPQ trip to Derby University

On Thursday 8th February, Mr Coucill accompanied 17 of our Year 12 students to the University of Derby for an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) work shop. The EPQ is a voluntary independent project that students can choose to take which allows them to research and produce a project of their choosing - either a 5000-word dissertation or an artefact such as a piece of art. Typically a school will have 5 or 6 students that opt to complete this additional project which equates to half an A level!

The group learned about different research methods, how to reference and collate their projects and were also allowed access to the university library. Mr Coucill and the university staff were very impressed with how our students engaged with the sessions, asking insightful questions and worked very hard to make plenty of notes!
