
Cost of Living Support



We have been informed about a new app that both helps to reduce food waste and supports those affected by the current cost of living difficulties. 'Too Good To Go' is free to download. It makes you aware of local supermarkets, shops, cafes etc who are selling food packages at a reduced cost each day. These include places like, Co-op, Starbucks and Morrisons. You can use the app to check the cost and reserve one of the bags. Each bag will contain a mixture of items that haven't sold by a certain time but where the food is still in date. You will be given a time slot to collect and pay for your bag.

Holocaust Survivor Visit: 11-11-22



As part of our RE curriculum, year 9 learn about the Holocaust. This year, we were extremely privileged to have a Holocaust survivor come to visit DCS.

Year 9 spent two lessons with Tomi who was born and grew up in Hungary. Tomi now finds it difficult to talk for extended periods of time, so year 9 initially watched a video with Tomi where he told his story. Year 9 listened so attentively and respectfully as they learnt that Tomi was forced to wear a yellow star on his clothes at all times because of his Jewish background. His recollection of the increased oppression and fear was both fascinating and difficult to hear especially when he said that it took him decades afterwards to admit to being a Jew. It made us all realise what a gift it is to live in a country and time where the law protects our individual freedoms and promotes tolerance and mutual respect.

Each year 9 tutor group had prepared some questions for Tomi who spent time answering each of them. We are really grateful for Tomi; for his time with us and his bravery in telling his story.

Well done to year 9 too for their interest and respect towards Tomi and this important part of world history.
