Task 3 – How might the type of family we live in change over our life course?

During our lives, our family types often change. For example, you might grow up in a nuclear family but then your parents may get divorced, so you become a reconstituted family or live in a lone parent family. Once you leave home, you might move in with your partner and enter a cohabiting family and so on.

I would like you to track the life course of somebody who is in late adulthood to see how families change over time. This could be a relative, a celebrity or a friend.

Success criteria:

- Draw a timeline to demonstrate how their family types have changed over time
- Refer to the different family types from task 2

<u>Task 4 – Enrichment Opportunity</u>

Once you start Sociology, you must actively use it in your everyday life. This includes engaging with wider enrichment opportunities.
