
Before you enter the school from reception

All visitors must sign in using the InVentry System in Reception. Each visitor is issued with a name badge and a coloured lanyard. This will be green if the visitor has provided DBS information and red if not. If a visitor is issued with a red lanyard, it means that they must not be allowed around school premises unaccompanied. School Staff have the right to challenge any visitor if they are unsure as to why that person is on the school site.

Please return the lanyard at the end of your visit.

If you are concerned about the conduct of a member of staff, please inform the Head Teacher immediately. If your concern regards the Head Teacher then please ask Reception Staff for the chair of governors contact details.



Safeguarding

Fire Safety

On discovering a fire:

Sound the alarm by breaking the glass on a call point or inform the nearest member of Staff

On hearing the fire alarm:

This is a continuous alarm sound.

Punctuated by an instruction to leave the building. Please evacuate the building by your nearest safest exit and go to the fire assembly point. This is the MUGA, behind the Sports Hall. Please report to the Reception Staff who will take a roll call. Please do not return to the building until you are instructed to do so.

Lockdown:

If you hear a continuous whistle this means that school is in 'lockdown'. Please follow the protocol that will be instigated by Staff.

First Aid:

For all First Aid requirements please contact The Medical Officer and/ or Reception in person or by telephoning 623/680/681. Please give the extent of the injury and the location of the injured person(s). The Medical Officer or Reception will organise a First Aid response. Please ensure that all accidents or near misses are reported.

Health and Safety:

Derby Cathedral School aims to provide a safe and healthy environment for students, staff and visitors. If during your time with us you notice any faulty or damaged equipment or potential hazards these should be reported immediately to Reception.
