
Derby Cathedral School

Dear Parent(s) and Carer(s),

Welcome to the start of the summer term – the final term of our first year in the new building! During the past two terms we have continued to face disruption due to Coronavirus. Despite this, we have managed to keep school open and focused on learning.

During the previous term we launched our Rewards Shop on Classcharts. Hopefully many of you are aware of this already. If not, then this rewards shop is an online shop where students are able to spend their positive points earnt during lessons and wider school activities. Please do have a look at the rewards shop with your child. We will be updating the rewards on offer based on student feedback later on in the term. As a whole school, students have earned over 421 000 points and approximately 90% of all points given are positive ones. This is an incredible achievement and we are so proud to see all of these positive behaviours every lesson, every day.

This is the first year that all of our students have been together as a school community, even our older year groups did not have the opportunity to mix with different year groups and learn to build those wider bonds.

The focus on community is going to be a strong one this term. We will be delivering sessions to students each week on various aspects of our behaviours that are important to help build a strong community. These will, of course, also be based around our FAITH values. Our students show a fantastic understanding of these values and how important they are in developing their own character. We now will be focusing on how these values are vital in building a strong school family.

As part of this, each year group will be working towards a particular focus. There will be more details to follow on this but our two oldest years are encountering some critical points in their school career. Year 10 will soon be embarking on work experience and getting prepared for their important year 11 GCSEs. Year 9 will soon be finding out which options they will be studying next year too. We will also be discussing our sixth form provision this term. This will mainly be focused on year 10 but the information will be shared with all parents/carers too. Our sixth form will open in September 2023

but all of our planning starts now!



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
Careers Update

National Careers Week : 7th – 11th March 2022

At the start of the week, students began by reflecting on what the word 'career' meant to them, and thinking about their own ambitions for the future. By the end of the week, they had made a 'pledge' to do something in relation to their ambitions. I was particularly impressed with 8 Bakewell's pledges, which included 'to learn more about my interests', 'to reserve a careers book from the LRC' and 'to get more involved in learning about my dream job'. Well done 8 Bakewell for demonstrating Aspiration!

Students also took part in career-related learning during curriculum time. Ahead of NCW, each teaching department had been challenged to deliver 'something' career-focused as part of their ordinary lessons. Special recognition goes to the Maths department, for their use of career-focused 'Start Now' activities for every year group all week, and to Geography, who created an excellent 'where can Geography take you?' display board.

Overall, National Careers Week was a great opportunity to get students thinking and asking questions about their future aspirations, and making the connection between their school subjects and the world of work. This will be continued through upcoming events and opportunities, such as the Step in to the NHS competition, Career of the Month and Year 10 Work Experience, as well as the ongoing use of the Unifrog careers platform during PSHE lessons.

Coronavirus Update

On Friday 1st April 2022, the Government announced their next steps for living with Covid-19. Most notably, free testing for the general public has now ended. School will no longer provide Lateral Flow Test kits to students. If a student is unwell with covid symptoms, they are now able to return to school as soon as their temperature subsides and they feel well enough – there is no longer a requirement to be absent for a minimum of 5 days. Safeguarding

Safeguarding concerns

If you have any concerns related to safeguarding then please do contact either social services or the police. If you feel that a child is in immediate danger then call 999.

If you believe that a child is at immediate risk and in need of protection then you should **call the police on 999** or if less urgent 101.

You can also keep the safeguarding team informed of any concerns or issues. However, please note that they are not in work so should not be used to report safeguarding concerns to over the holidays. Please feel welcome to email just to keep them informed of any situations.

Please note these email addresses are not regularly monitored during school holidays.

We have recently been made aware that there are some shops in Derby who are selling vape products to under-18s.

This is illegal and we have reported this to the police. It is also illegal for anyone under 18 to buy vape products. As such, any vape products brought into school or used by our students in public will result in the confiscation of any items found and a sanction as part of our behaviour system. You will also be informed.

We know that this only affects a very small proportion of teenagers. However, with the local concern around the illegal selling of these products, we wanted to bring this matter to your attention. If you are concerned that your child is involved in vaping and wish to talk to us about accessing support, you are very welcome to do so. Please contact your child's tutor in the first instance.

We have recently been made aware that some students have been scratching their hands and arms, usually using compasses. This seems to be a national situation and not just at Derby Cathedral School or Derby more generally.

We ask that parents remain vigilant around this behaviour and please report any incidence to your child's form tutor in the first instance.

Parentpay

DCS is a cashless school and use a payment platform called Parentpay. All parents/carers have been assigned activation details. This allows you to pay for school shop items/ trips & visits/ lunch money and much more. If you are still yet to activate your account or need reminding of your unique details, please get in touch and colleagues will assist.

An increasing number of students are spending over their daily allowance or available funds. If you do not wish your child to accrue a negative balance, please get in touch. We are able to apply a maximum daily spend limit to your child's account to help them manage their balance.

Free School Meals

Derby City Council will be issuing Free School Meal vouchers to eligible families to cover the Easter holiday as part of the ongoing support for families. Vouchers will be sent out during the last week of term and have a value of £25 to cover the 2-week holiday. As before, the vouchers can be redeemed at any of the following supermarkets: Aldi, Asda. Farm Foods, Iceland, Marks & Spencer, Morrisons, Sainsbury, Tesco & Waitrose.
