Dear Parent(s) and Carer(s),

It's lovely to start to see the signs of Spring this term. This half term signifies our halfway point through the school year and it is always nice to have the better weather to look forward to.

In terms of coronavirus restrictions, we are still under the direction of our regional public health team who have been concerned about the cases in Derby. However, it's also been great to see opportunities for our students start to open up again. Please do take time to read the news stories in this newsletter; I know that our staff and students have really enjoyed being able to do some small local trips/visits recently.

Our year 10 students are now just over a year away from their GCSE examinations. Their first set of mock assessment results were maturely received last week and we will be following these up with a range of strategies to support further revision. Staff are offering a wide variety of intervention study sessions that many of our year 10 students have attended already. All other year groups will also participate in formal assessments and a range of study support sessions. All students now have the majority of their homework set through knowledge organisers. These are key to support students in learning the key knowledge needed for each of their subjects. Parents/carers and any family members can help support this by testing this knowledge; all the answers are on the page so you don't need to be an expert yourself!

This next half term sees the senior leadership team start to plan our Sixth Form provision in more detail. This will open in September 2023 but applications will be accepted by year 11 students in the Autumn of 2022. This is a really exciting development for the school and we are looking forward to including our current year 9 and 10 students in our decision making.

Another aspect of a developing school is the ongoing staff recruitment that is needed for our additional student cohorts. We have already appointed a number of new teaching staff for September 2022 for the following subjects: English, maths, science, history, Spanish, business, PE, art & DT. We will also be recruiting a number of additional support staff to enable our students and staff to continue to receive strong levels of pastoral and wider support. Year 6 offer day is on 1 March and we also look forward to welcoming our next year 7 cohort.

I hope that you and your family have a happy and restful half term break and we look forward to welcoming our students back next week.





Dear Parents and Carers.

Despite reports that COVID infections are failing, we are still seeing a high number of COVID cases in the City, over 2000 each week. Cases in children are at their highest since the start of the pandemic. Many schools and early years providers are working extremely hard to keep settings open while ensuring children and staff are safe. Despite this we have a number of settings that have needed to take additional actions to respond to outbreaks.

I am writing to ask for your help and support to reduce Covid-19 spread and keep schools and settings open. I hope that, by working together, we can keep children in face to face education for the coming months.

We continue to advise schools and childcare providers to:

- Increase ventilation inside and to be outside as much as possible.
- Ensure a continued focus on thorough and frequent cleaning, along with increased handwashing and sanitising.
- Ask parents to continue to wear face coverings at drop-off and pick-up or if they visit inside.
- Ask staff to continue to wear face coverings where possible and appropriate, including in communal areas in some schools with outbreaks.
- Encourage staff and secondary school children to use the home testing/ lateral flow kits
 twice a week and report results. These tests are to use regularly when you do not have any
 symptoms. Our advice is that these tests can also be used by Primary aged children if
 parents are happy to do this.
- Identify any contacts of positive cases and provide advice that is based on the setting's
 rates of infection.
- Remind everyone that those with symptoms need to stay at home and take a PCR test.
 Children should not return to the setting before the result comes back and staff may ask to see the result.
- Remind everyone who is positive for COVID that they need to isolate at home.
- In some outbreak situations head teachers may ask household contacts to stay at home until they have had a negative PCR result.

I am asking parents to:

- Continue to use the home testing/ lateral flow kits twice a week and report the results.
 Parents can use them with younger children if they feel able to.
- Wear a face covering if you need to gather with others when you drop-off or collect your child, unless exempt. Some settings continue to require this.
- If your child has COVID symptoms (a new cough, a temperature or loss of taste/smell)
 please keep them at home and arrange a PCR test. If your school currently has an
 outbreak then other symptoms such as sore throat or cold symptoms may also indicate
 COVID infection.
- If your child is identified as a contact, please follow the advice provided by your school or childcare provider. This might include a bookable PCR test, daily LFTs for children over 5 or younger if parents agree. In some circumstances your child may be asked to move to home learning.
- If there is a current outbreak in your child's school, or your child is identified as a contact, please consider the activities they undertake out of the school setting. Please consider reducing their contact with vulnerable people, including those who are older or in poor health, for the period of the outbreak.

Thank you for your support in keeping your setting open and everyone safe.

SECONDARY SCHOOL BASED VACCINATIONS FOR TEENAGE BOOSTER (DTP) AND MENINGOCOCCAL ACWY (MEN ACWY)

The School Age Immunisation Service (SAIS) for Derbyshire and Derby City will be offering <u>all year 9</u> students the Teenage Booster (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Polio) and Meningococcal ACWY (Men ACWY) vaccinations during the Spring Term.

Please visit https://www.derbyshireandcityimms.co.uk/Forms/DTP to complete the consent form. The option to consent or decline the vaccination is at the end of the questionnaire so please complete even if you do not want your child to have the vaccination.

Covid-19 Booster Vaccinations for 12-15 year Olds

Following national guidance we will be offering the second dose of Covid-19 vaccination to young people age 12 – 15 and will be continuing to use the e-consent as with other vaccine programmes. We are also able to offer the first dose in school if your child hasn't yet received a vaccination.

<u>Children must be 12 on the day of vaccination. Please complete the consent regardless of whether you have completed one previously. We will only use newly completed forms.</u>

There must be a gap of 12 weeks (84 days) between first and second doses. If there isn't then your child will be refused vaccination on the day. Please only consent if your child will be eligible. There must also be a gap of 12 weeks between Covid infection and vaccination. If your child contracts Covid after completing the form or receives their vaccine elsewhere, please let the team know so we can remove them from our list.

If possible, please make sure your child is wearing short sleeves and eats breakfast on the day of vaccination.

Please be aware that due to storage requirements of the vaccine the team will need to know the number of vaccines needed in advance. Therefore, the consent system will close 2 working days prior to the session at 9am. If your school session is on a Monday, the form will close the Thursday before and schools on Tuesday will close on Friday. We will not be able to add extra forms once it has closed.

Please note these email addresses are not regularly monitored during school holidays.

We have recently been made aware that there are some shops in Derby who are selling vape products to under-18s.

This is illegal and we have reported this to the police. It is also illegal for anyone under 18 to buy vape products. As such, any vape products brought into school or used by our students in public will result in the confiscation of any items found and a sanction as part of our behaviour system. You will also be informed.

We know that this only affects a very small proportion of teenagers. However, with the local concern around the illegal selling of these products, we wanted to bring this matter to your attention. If you are concerned that your child is involved in vaping and wish to talk to us about accessing support, you are very welcome to do so. Please contact your child's tutor in the first instance.

We have recently been made aware that some students have been scratching their hands and arms, usually using compasses. This seems to be a national situation and not just at Derby Cathedral School or Derby more generally.

We ask that parents remain vigilant around this behaviour and please report any incidence to your child's form tutor in the first instance.
