Dear Parent(s) and Carer(s),

The end of this school year seems to have come round very quickly and what a year it has been! I don't think it's a time in our lives that we're going to forget very quickly.

As I reflect over these past 12 months, I am really struck by how brightly our school values have shone through, particularly when times got a bit tougher. Our students have been working so hard on understanding what our FAITH values stand for and how they can demonstrate these values in their daily lives. These have encouraged them to stay focused on the good, positive aspects of our lives that we have and enable us all to 'live life in all its fullness (John 10:10), no matter what our circumstances are.

Teaching staff have worked incredibly hard to improve the quality of remote learning during lockdown periods. This took a great deal of effort, having to learn a new skill very quickly and change their planning frequently at the drop of a hat. However, they all really enjoyed being able to be in touch with students and have a much better idea of their academic progress. This has really made a difference to their return to school. They have also prioritised students in continuing to provide as many practical and extra-curricular activities as the restrictions have allowed. Giving as much of a sense of normality to our students at all times has been a key goal of ours.

Our TAs and pastoral staff have also provided much needed consistency and support throughout the year and kept in touch with students who needed that additional support. Expanding our support through in-school counselling has also meant that more students can quickly access this type of help.

Support staff have also made sure that all of the functions of school run smoothly, despite the context of constant change. They have managed to set up our school Covid test centre, organised food parcels, vouchers, home test kits, additional cleaning and delivered support in to the community and all sorts of added extras that we've had to deal with.

As parents, we have really appreciated your encouraging comments and communication throughout the year. This makes such a difference to staff. Most of all, the constant support you provide for your child/children has helped them to cope with the big changes we've experienced. We really appreciate how you've worked in partnership with us throughout.

I started by talking about our students and I'd like to return to them again. They are, of course, our key priority and the reason why we all do our jobs. Throughout this year, we have had so many moments of encouragement where we have been so impressed with the tenacity, fellowship and humility shown by them on a daily basis. It is often through tough times that we develop our character the most. This is really apparent in our students; I am extremely proud and privileged to have worked with them this year and look forward to seeing more of this next year.

The move to our new building is obviously a great focus of positivity and celebration – especially for our year 9 students, it has been a long wait! Please do read the information sent out about this and take time to plan the new route to school. All students have also received this information at the end of term. Our building ambassadors have visited the site and will be feeding back to their tutor group.

Please do take some time to read through the rest of the newsletter. It contains some key messages and a section on news from the classroom. There is also information on keeping safe over the summer

A message from the Headteacher with some key contacts for support groups if any students or families experience any difficulties over this time.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all again for your support this year. I wish you and your family and very happy summer and look forward to seeing all of our students again in our new building!

INSET day Tasks

As students have two extra INSET days at the start of term, we are setting some work for them to help give them a head start to the new term.

A big focus for our school next year is reading and ensuring that all students have a reading age that is the same as their actual age. So our year 7 and 8 students will be given a choice of tasks based on reading books of their choice. If they don't have books at home, or have read them all, we advise you to go and register at your local library.

Year 9 students will be given a work pack that helps to prepare them for their GCSE year 10 studies.

Year 6 students will be sent a transition pack of various activities to complete focused on English, maths and science.

These tasks can be completed at any time over the holidays to suit your family holiday arrangements.

We do expect all students to bring these back to school on their first day back.

These activities will be emailed to parents, given to students and will be uploaded on our school website under the Study support – Summer Learning tab.

Coronavirus Updates

Lateral Flow tests

The requirement to continue with these stops over the summer break.

We will be offering two lateral flow tests in school for all student before the start of term and will be providing lateral flow home test kits after this for the rest of September.

It is really important to note that these tests are designed to pick up any asymptomatic cases. If your child has any of the Covid-related symptoms (high temperature, persistent cough, loss of taste/smell) then they must have a PCR test as well. Symptoms over the summer holiday

If your child develops symptoms (as described above) at any point, they must get a PCR test and self-isolate until either the result returned is negative or ten days have passed from the start of any symptoms. All members of the household must also self-isolate during this time.

Uniform and Equipment needed for September

In order to be ready for the start back to school, please make sure that your child/children are well-prepared with the following items. We expect all students to have all necessary equipment with them everyday. They must have:

- A pencil case
- Pens: blue, black and purple
- pencils
- Rubber
- Ruler
- Pencil sharpener
- Whiteboard pen
- Reading book

Please can you ensure that your child has all of these items ready for the start of the next half term. Tutors will be performing regular equipment checks and negative behaviour points will be issued for missing equipment.

Our uniform requirements are written in detail on our website. Please read through the following reminders so that you and your child are clear on our expectations

- Trousers are grey, not black and they are not of a skinny fit/legging style.
- Skirts must be at least knee length
- Trainers cannot be worn
- No jewellery is permitted other than one pair of small stud earrings.
- No fake nails or nail polish is allowed
- No false eyelashes are allowed
- School PE kit with their school blazer or jumper only on PE days no hoodies are allowed.

Please note that any other items of jewellery will be confiscated and kept in reception for students to collect at the end of the day. If this becomes a persistent problem then parents will be asked to collect. If your child has a recent piercing that is not allowed (i.e. a second set of ear piercings or a nose piercing), we will not allow them to wear it whilst it heals.

We will be preforming daily uniform checks in September and students will be expected to be in correct uniform in order to be in lessons.

Summer activities

The Derby Summer Promise for activities is built around national funding from the Holiday Activities and Food programme (HAF) and the Local Support Summer Grant which has been used in connection with partners to develop a fantastic programme of providers and support.

Parents and carers throughout Derby may be eligible to benefit from a free holiday clubs programme for children and young people over the school summer break

The Summer Promise, aims to provide activities, ranging from sports, to cooking and performing, to thousands of children in Derby who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals and has approved dozens of local and national organisations to run free holiday activity clubs to enable children and young people to enjoy fun activities with friends and learn and develop new skills.

It has been a very busy term for the history department at DCS.

Year 7 have been enjoying learning about the reign of Elizabeth I. They were particularly interested in finding out how the English were able to defeat the Spanish Armada and what this famous victory meant for Elizabeth and the nation as a whole. They have also discovered that life as a school child in Tudor times was a lot harder than they thought even if schoolchildren could drink beer!

Year 8 have been learning about the development of industry in Victorian England and the gruesome crimes of 'Jack the Ripper'. They have been studying the evidence of these terrible murders and developing their own theories as to who the mysterious rippper might have been. Mathematics

The Maths department, this year, held the UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge for 20 year 9 students and the Junior Maths Challenge for 30 students each from Year 7 and 8. This was a national level Maths Challenge that allowed students to experience problem solving and compete against students from all over the country. All pupils showed great integrity and tenacity in the challenge and the school is extremely proud of them all.

Out of the year 9 pupils, Sonia won a bronze certificate in the Intermediate Maths Challenge. Out of the year 7 pupils, Ashton scored the highest and received a silver certificate. Amongst the year 8 pupils, Laura won a gold certificate and was best in her year.

Furthermore, three year 8 students: Jake, Hannah and Laura went on to qualify for the next level: Junior Maths Kangaroo and out of these, Jake scored a certificate of merit.

As a school, we are extremely proud of all our mathematicians who participated, regardless of the outcomes. These students and their hard work despite the pandemic, is an inspiration for their peers and we hope that they only continue to excel and set an example for all others at Derby Cathedral School. Music

Our year 7 students have been working on a band skills project in which chords, melody and rhythm are played on a number of students (ukulele, keyboard, voice and percussion) as an ensemble performance (group performance). Students have particularly enjoyed working on these instruments and learning current songs. They were also surprised at the number of popular songs that only use four chords!

Our current year 8 and 9 students have been working on DAW (digital audio workstations) to sequence and compose music. Using music technology, us a great way to scaffold learning and really supports creative compositions, as students have a range of instrument sounds to select from.

Mrs Eaton has just completed her training to become an Arts award assessor and we are really excited to offer our students this opportunity from September. We will be running both the bronze and silver award, and students can choose to complete the award in either music, dance, drama or art. More information will be sent to parents in September.
