With electronic timing systems in place, competitors dashed between checkpoints, working in pairs and teams to complete the course in the fastest time possible. The layout featured a mix of open spaces and trickier wooded areas, testing both speed and strategy. The event would not have been possible without the dedicated British Orienteering volunteers, who guided the children, ensured fair play, and even provided top tips on technique. Their enthusiasm helped to create a fun and encouraging atmosphere, allowing every participant to develop their confidence and skills. As the final runners crossed the finish line, there were cheers, high-fives, and a great sense of achievement all around. Regardless of rankings, every child left with a smile, having experienced the thrill of orienteering and the camaraderie of competition.
