Whilst that is their prerogative, we would much rather that dialogue was with us directly, as we are best placed to answer any questions and provide clear rationale, rather than what can sometimes be a diluted or misleading response from others when passed on second or third hand.

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Student absence

The winter season has seen an increase in absence due to various bugs and viruses- unfortunate but unavoidable. Can we please remind parents/carers of the following:

- Absences must be reported daily- either via the Absence line (01380 724886 and option 1) or the Arbor app
- We often feel better once we get going, so if your child wakes up feeling a little under the weather, then a dose of medication before sending them on their way can often be all that's needed
- Monitor your child's absence- if there appears to be odd absences of a regular nature, is there a pattern to it? A day of the week? A change in the family routine? Be inquisitive and always seek medical advice early if needed
- If you're ever unsure of whether your child should attend school based on their symptoms- use the NHS website as a guide- <https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/>
- Please always be honest- don't pretend your child is unwell if there's a different, underlying reason for their absence- good communication is key
- Do reinforce our attendance messages at home: Attendance = Progress!
