



# Mr. Cave's weekly message:

We've held our House assemblies this week, as the competition hots up between Avebury, Roundway and Silbury. Each week the houses score points for the Championship based on the student's house point scores, school and club attendance, and performance in various challenges. From spelling bees to 1v1 football tournaments, litter picks to Science fairs, there have been plenty of

opportunities to earn points for their houses lately! We often share the names of each house's highest scorers during our morning line up and celebrate their commitment to success both as an individual and a house member. We also held our latest HERO raffles last week, where one student from each year group was rewarded with an Amazon voucher for being 'Here, Every day, Ready and On time'. We are always looking for ways to recognise those who make the most of their secondary school experience.

Next week our Year 7-10 students will complete their latest 'National Guided Reading Tests' in lessons. These assessments offer us vital information regarding our students reading and comprehension ability, and whether they are in line with students of their age bracket. We use this information to focus our interventions on those who may find understanding written information- including texts, sources or assessment questions- more challenging than their peers and prevent good progress as a result. It's important our students put their full effort into these assessments for an accurate picture, so do talk to them about it and look out for the results when we share this information with you.

### **Uniform**

Please ensure that your child attends school in the correct uniform each day. We have recently seen a slight rise in students attending with issues around uniform that cause unnecessary negative conversations to be the first contact point in their day, and waste learning time whilst they are resolved. Students should come with a note from home if they are missing an item of uniform that is expected (e.g. tie or shoes), with a clear timeframe for its resolution. In relation to some of the situations we have recently had to spend time resolving:

- Students should only wear simple studs in their ears, not sleepers or hoops or overly elaborate studs. There should be no other piercings of any kinds- do not allow your child to get a piercing that they will only be expected to remove immediately, as it is a waste of money and learning time
- Only nude nail polish is permitted- no gel or acrylic nails
- Trainers are not permitted- black, polishable shoes are expected
- Hoodies are not coats and not to be worn on school premises
