

#### School Swimming Lessons



Swimming and Water Safety is included within the national curriculum PE programme of study.



Primary school is the only opportunity some young people will have to learn these important life-enhancing and potentially life-saving skills.



Swimming is an activity with numerous physical, mental and developmental benefits for all young people.

As an island nation with a wide range of rivers, lakes and canals, water is everywhere. At some point in their life every child will be around water.

By the time a child is ready to leave primary school they should be able to swim, know how to get out of trouble if they fall into water, know the dangers of water and understand how to stay safe when playing in and around it.

Swimming lessons will take place over the course of the year for children in years 4,5 and 6 at either Bolton School or Horwich Leisure Centre. The expectation is for all children to be able to achieve the following objectives before they leave primary school:

Swim over 25 metres

Use a range of strokes (back stroke, breast stroke and front crawl) Perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations.

Certificates will be awarded to the children as and when the objectives have been achieved.

More information will be sent out separately, but for now, here are details of what your child will need to wear for their swimming lessons:

#### Boys-no shorts

Girls—one piece swimming costume Children MUST wear a swimming cap.

Children CANNOT wear goggles without a doctor's note We respect that some children will prefer to cover their body for religious reasons and this is allowed where practicable. IF you are unsure of what your child can where, please contact the

Class of the term to date: Y4W 97.4% This is fantastic, keep going!


#### Celebrating Excellent Punctuality
