Last Friday, Year 6 took part in a workshop on road safety delivered by The Riot Act in collaboration with Bolton Council. As the Year 6 pupils entered the hall, they were faced with a dramatic scene: there had been an accident. There was blood on the floor, a bag, a mobile phone and some headphones, a football, a car with blood on the bonnet and a bicycle nearby. The children had to investigate the scene and try to work out what might have happened. The children were told about each of the people involved in the accident and they heard witness statements from each of them. There were lots of amazing questions asked and some very clever deductions made about the accident (some budding investigators amongst us!). The take home message was about staying safe on the road, and the one person that can keep us the safest is US! Please encourage your child to be vigilant when on the streets, put away any technology they may be using and be aware of what is going on around them. 
