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# This Week in Year 5

#### English

Last week we had an immersion into our new text, 'The Explorer'. This week we are going to write our first chapter focusing on the main character of Fred as his plane crashed into the Amazon Rainforest.

#### **Maths**

This week, we are learning how to do long multiplication. We started off by learning how to complete an area model which helped represent the multiplications visually. Next, we began to do long multiplication in the written method. It can be tricky but as long as we remember the rules and know our times tables, we will succeed.

### **Money Matters**

Following on from our Debt Aware lesson a few months ago, we recapped what we learnt, however this time, the children took charge and led the lesson. They did a fantastic job with ensuring the class were engaged and focused on the task and they used clear voices to explain their statements. Well done!

#### PΕ

In our outdoor PE this term, we are learning the skills of fielding and striking and relating that to a game of cricket. We have practised batting the ball from a stationary tee and building on this skill. In indoor PE, the children are learning gymnastics and how to travel around a safe space, showing poise and elegance. We are also learning how to correctly perform cartwheels, maintaining straight legs and good balance.

### History

Our unit this term is all about the Anglo-Saxons and the Scots. We began our lessons learning about who the Anglo-Saxons were, where they came from, and why they settled in England. This week, we looked into the Staffordshire Hoard, where an abundance of gold, silver and metal fragments were found dating from the Anglo-Saxon era resulting in the largest hoard of Anglo-Saxon gold EVER found.
