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


This Week in Year 4

- We have lots of children creating stories at home. Jude was very excited to share his comic book this week.






























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#geography

COVID's Still Here

We are sharing information about Bolton Council's new COVID awareness campaign, 'COVID's Still Here'.

COVID-19 has not gone away, the virus is still circulating in our community and it is vital we all take steps to stop it from spreading. The vaccine programme has weakened the link between cases, hospitalisations and deaths but COVID still poses a significant risk to our health, our children's education and the local economy.

The campaign stresses the importance of keeping everyone safe through useful tips including:

- ♦ Getting vaccinated
- Letting fresh air in if you meet indoors (and meeting outdoors is safer)
- Wearing a face covering in crowded and enclosed settings where you come into contact with people you do not normally meet
- Getting tested, and self-isolate if required
- Trying to stay at home if you are feeling unwell
- Washing your hands
- Downloading and using the NHS COVID-19 app

Bolton Council's Director of Public Health, Dr Helen Lowey, said:

"This new campaign will provide a useful reminder that COVID has not gone away.

"After restrictions were lifted earlier this year, and as we head into the winter months, there is a real risk that cases will increase.

"I urge everyone to look out for the COVID's Still Here campaign and follow the advice to help keep Bolton safe and to help keep everything open through the winter."
