Road and Parking Safety

Unfortunately, we have had a couple of 'near misses' around the school this week. One incident, a child in year 3 was nearly knocked over when a car reversed without looking. The other incident involved children being let out of the car on the roadside. It is ALL of our responsibilities to ensure that children, parents/carers and the wider community are safe on the local roads. Please be considerate, park safely and drive at no more than 10mph around the school perimeter.

Slow down and concentrate:

- Always drive slowly—20mph or below in communities, 10mph around the school
- Switch your phone off and put it in the glove box Don't drive children all the way to school:
- Try to walk to school where possible
- If it's too far to walk, try and park safely some distance from school and walk the rest of the way
- Always drive considerately, be aware of pedestrians and other vehicles

Fit and use child restraints:

- ALWAYS use a baby or child seat suitable for your child's size and weight
- Rear facing seats are safer for babies
- Children under 150cm tall MUST use a child seat
- ALWAYS check that All children are restrained before setting off



Never:

- Never hold a child in your arms in a vehicle
- Never use one adult seat belt to restrain more than one person
- Never carry anyone else's child in your car if you do not have an appropriate child restraint
- Never allow someone to travel unrestrained
- Never leave children alone in vehicles
- Never park on the zig zags
- Never block a driveway
- Never drive down Baines Street or block the
- entrance to Baines Street at school drop off or pick up
