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| Safety & Security | Staff and children could be at risk from unauthorised persons on premises. Staff and Children could be at risk from fire. Children could be at risk from harm | All perimeter doors and entrances are locked. EYFS Staff have a set of keys for the shutter and doors. Children do not have access to Outdoor Area at the beginning or end of the day, when school gates open (08.30-9.00am and 2.50-3.15pm). During these times the classroom door to the Outside Area is locked from the inside. Daily check to ensure clear pathway out of the class as this is a designated fire exit. Children are always supervised by a member of staff when using the Outdoor Learning Environment. Gates checked regularly for maintenance. Children could be scalded by hot liquids | All taps at hand washing and other facilities, at which children have access, are fitted with Thermostatic mixing valves to prevent water being discharged above 36° C. TMV's serviced annual and have automatic failsafe. Staff to have hot drinks in sealed cups. No mugs with hot drinks are allowed within the setting. Staff to add water to the water tray outside from the taps. When baking, if the children are using the ovens, an object such as a table, will be placed infront of it so no children can access it. Water is fresh at the beginning of each day and as needed during sessions. Cleaning resources are washed/disinfected regularly. Children are not allowed to climb on the water tray. Children are taught to not put resources in their mouths. Warm water to be used in the winter months. If it is not safe to use due to freezing conditions, water tray will be out of use. Water resources to be stored at the end of the day in the shed. Follow public health advice about when to close off water e.g. Scarlet fever outbreak/gastroenteritis bugs. Children trained to sweep up spillages. Adults and children walk indoors at all times. The floor surface is easy to clean. Children are warned of the dangers of throwing or flicking sand. Sand is changed periodically or when known to be contaminated. Sand is to be kept under the shelter. This is locked away so no animals can get into it. Only 'Children's Play Sand' from reputable companies is used. Containers and toys for sand are cleaned when needed. Children trained not to eat sand. | Small Equipment / Choking hazards | Pupils. Pupils placing food, toys or small items in their mouths, nose or ears, which could become stuck; Death, asphyxiation, choking, poisoning, damage, irritation, infection. | Adequate supervision at all times. Children are taught not to put toys in their mouths, noses or ears. Only toys which are good quality, non-toxic and appropriate for the age of the children are used. All play equipment and toys are purchased from reputable suppliers and are inspected for defects. Any defective items are removed immediately. M will often put small items in her mouth. | Special medical, behavioural needs of specific children | The children's needs may impact on their safety and well being. | The school ensures that: Up-to-date information regarding special/medical needs of all children will be obtained. Advice will be taken from the School nurse/SENCO/doctor/and parents/guardians, if appropriate. Individual needs and associated specific risks will be identified, recorded and shared with all relevant personnel. The children will have written parental consent if medication is taken or required. (via office) Parents will be reminded (via letter) to bring personal medication if required. Staff will be fully briefed regarding those with known special/medical needs and trained to treat/respond accordingly. Medical/parental consent form will give details of any medication/first aid treatment that parents give consent to. | Outdoor Provision | Children may be injured falling/tripping on raised surfaces | Outdoor Area is shaped like an L. There is a corner where you can't see around the side. The outdoor area is one large space and we have split it ourselves into 3 areas. Area 1: Junk modelling, welly tree, exit and emergency exit and sand Area 2: grassed area and stage Area 3: Water play, sensory/mud kitchen, tuff trays, shed (around the corner). We have decided as a school, if one adult is outside, the children can only use Area 1 and 2 together or 2 and 3 together. This is decided by an adult and the fence panels put in place so the children cannot go beyond the barrier. If two adults are out, 1 adult basis themselves in Area 1 and the other adult basis themselves in area 2 or 3. No more than 20 children outside at a time unless the playground is also in use or more adults are outside. Outdoor area checked each morning. Trip hazards identified and corrected immediately Area outside of the shutter is sometimes accessed when it shouldn't be outside of school hours, the area must be checked daily before the children have access to it. | Splinters | Pupils. Children could get a splinter from resources; cuts, scratches, infection. | EYFS members of staff to check resources regularly to ensure they are smooth and clean. Any resources that are not smooth and could cause splinters should be removed straight away. When a child gets a splinter, staff should not try and remove it. Parents and carers to be contacted. | Weather | Pupils. Children burning in the sun and becoming dehydrated. Cold, wet or windy weather causing falls or slips. Children becoming too cold or wet; Sunburn, broken bones, bruises, dehydration, hyperthermia. | Ensure children are dressed appropriately for outdoor play (sun hats, wellies, rain coats, waterproofs, sun cream). Provide shade during sunny weather. Limit the time spent in full sun. Encourage children to drink frequently. Encourage children to move frequently to limit the effects of cold weather. Change children out of wet clothes as soon as is practical. Staff are not to apply sun cream to the children but can support them with them applying it themselves. All children are aware of the rules – do not touch/eat any of these plants, which could be harmful, wash your hands after being outside. | Balance Bikes | Pupils – injuries, falls, grazes, broken bones | Equipment is checked regularly. Bikes are adjusted to the children's height. All staff have watched the safety videos on how to fit the helmets. Bikes are stored up high so the children do not have free access to them. Children have 1 balance bike lesson a week. Ratio of 1:6 when using the bikes for the Balanceability lessons. Free play- can be used on the track on the playground with additional supervision from EYFS staff.
