

Iceland has a polar climate

Climate zones	large regions of the world that have similar weather and climate
Biomes	large regions of the world with similar climate, landscapes,
Time zones	the time in a certain place which differs depending on its
Longitude	imaginary lines that run from the top of Earth to the bottom
Greenwich time	(GMT) a line of longitude also known as Prime Meridian
Temperate	rain is spread across the year; winters are cold, summers are
Cattle	large mammals that people raise for their meat or milk


