Similarities to other religions

Islam: Islam has preserved this tradition in the form of ablution and ritual *Ghusl* for purification purpose.

Hindu: Namakarana is a Hindu naming ceremony. This takes place 12 days after birth.

Judaism: Followers are baptised, often as adults where they are fully submerged.

Sikhism: Naam Karan is a Sikh naming ceremony where babies are welcomed to the communiy.
