Glad to report the weather was kind this week for our Y5 children who participated in their Bikeability Course. Here are some of them perfecting their skills. Well done to everyone for your efforts and of course a big thank you to the instructors for their dedication.















Year 6 had the pleasure of welcoming a few members of Greater Manchester Fire Service for a very important workshop on fire safety around Halloween and Bonfire Night. They discussed ways of staying safe around

fireworks and bonfires, as well as top tips. The children all engaged brilliantly, asking interesting questions and sharing their own experiences. We finished with a discussion and demonstration of the equipment the fire fighters use when responding to emergencies!







This week, the children took part in an assembly about the WOW Walk to School Challenge. We are encouraging all children to walk to school to help build healthy habits and reduce our impact on the environment.

Each day, we will use the Travel Tracker to record how children travel to school. If the children walk, cycle, scoot or park and stride to school at least once a week they get rewarded with a monthly-collectable badge. These badges are recyclable and designed by children, with a different design to collect each month. Families who usually drive can still take part by using 'Park and Stride', park 10 minutes away and walk the rest. We recommend Morrisons as a suitable place to

park and stride. The challenge will begin after half term, starting the week commencing 3rd November. Thank you for your support!




