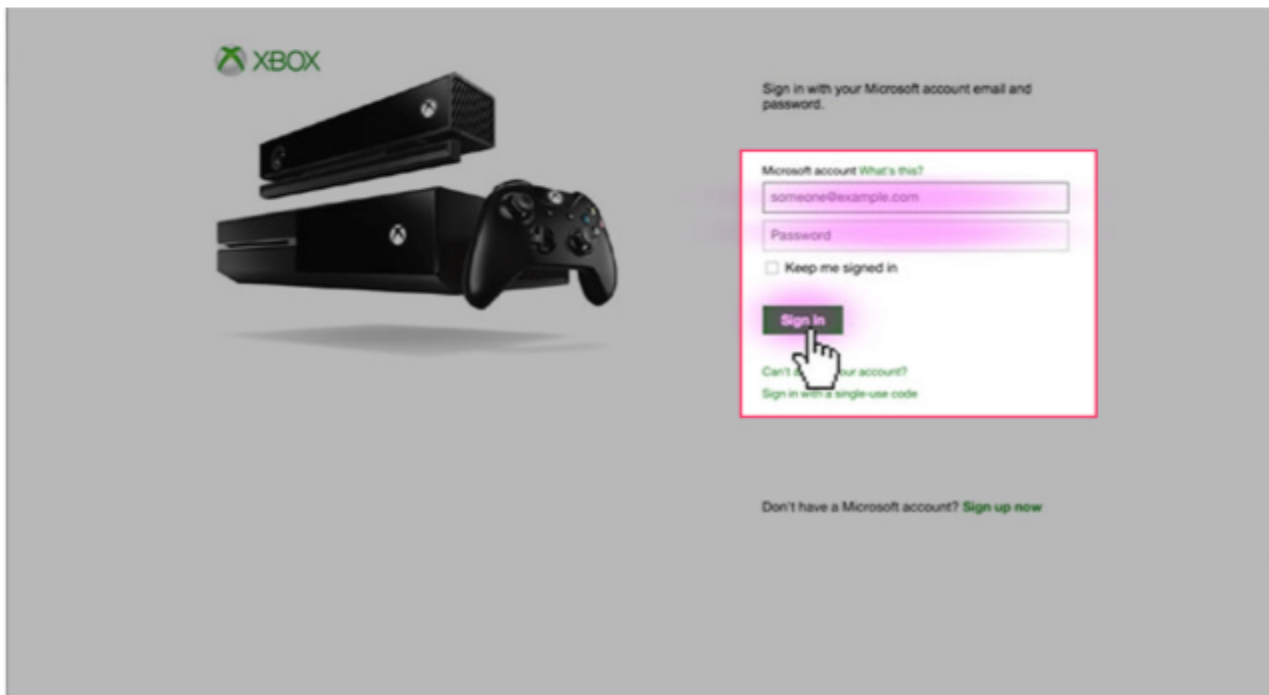

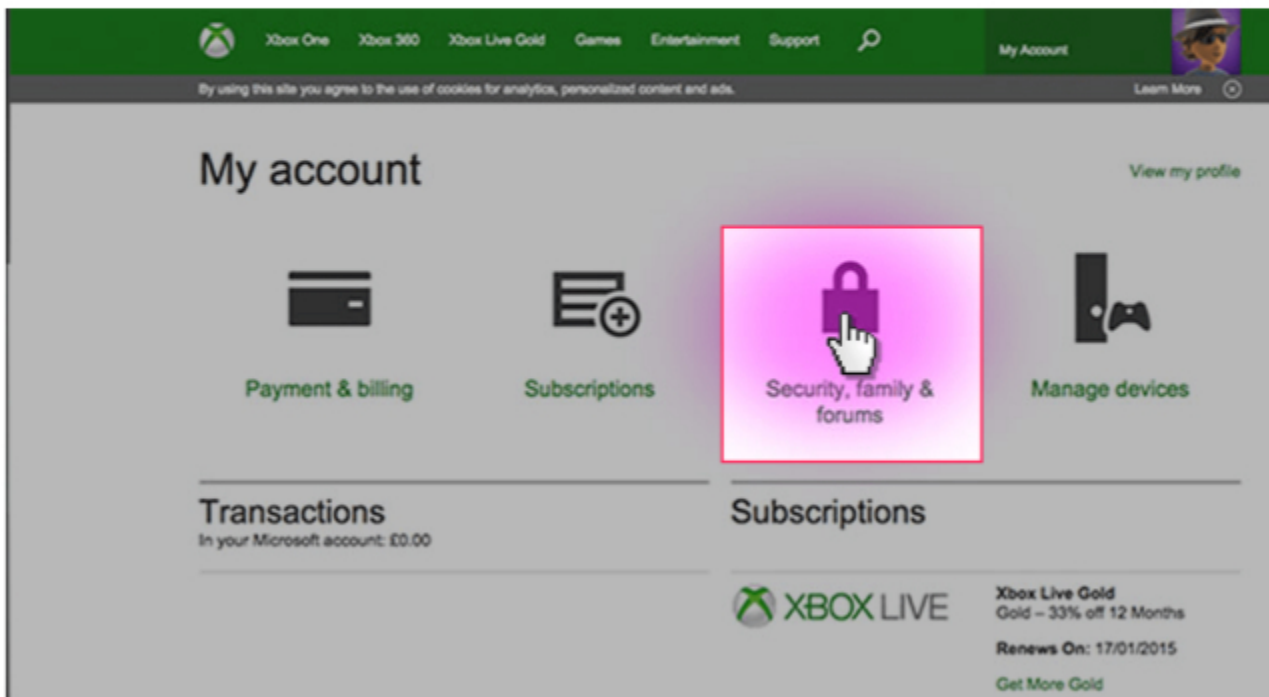

Step by Step instructions

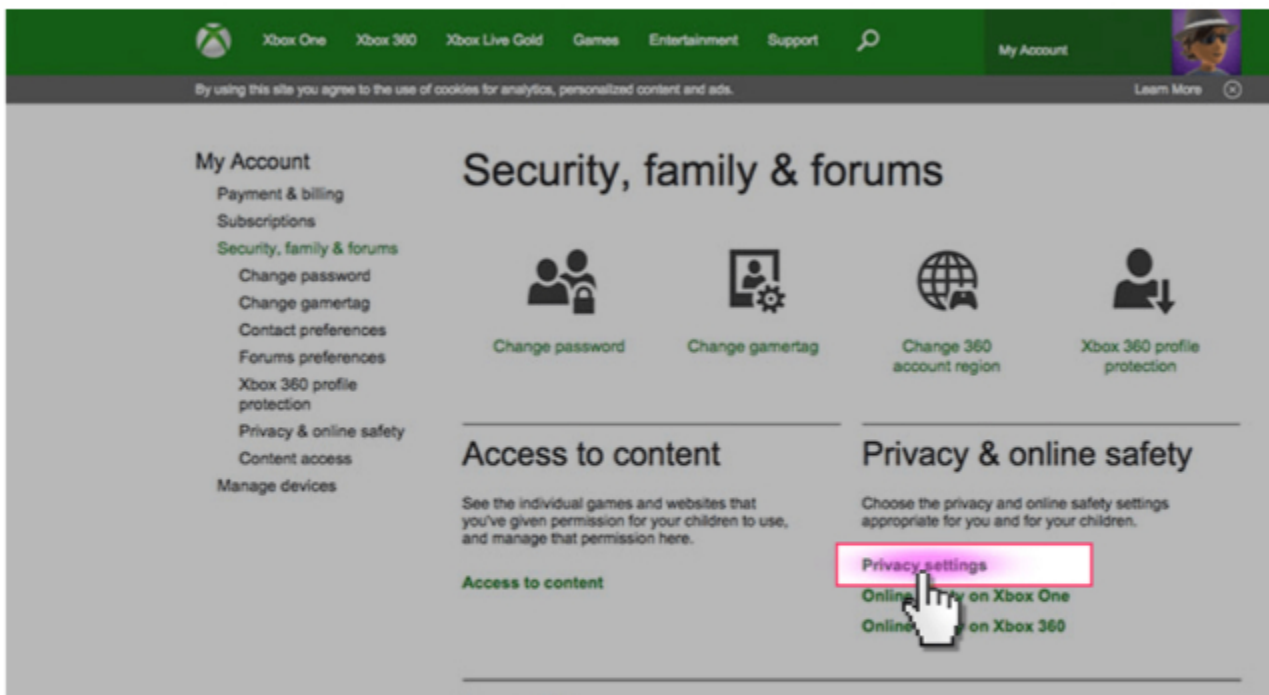
1. Go to Your Xbox account and sign into the Xbox Live account using the email address and password.



2. On your account home screen click on the 'Security, family & forums' icon.



3. Click on the 'Privacy settings' button.



4. Select your protection level in each category to suit your family needs.
