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



#### **DfE changes to Penalty Notices**

The Department for Education have recently announced national charges to penalty notices issues for unauthorised absences in term time, these came into into effect on the 19th August 2024.

- Penalty notices issued for the offence after the 19th of August 2024 will be charged at the new rate of £160.00 however if paid in 21-days this reduces to £80.00.
- Any second penalty notice to the same parent for the same child in a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160.00 to be paid within 28-days with no option for a discount.
- Penalty notice threshold is 10-sessions equivalent to 5-days of unauthorised absence in a rolling 10school week period.
- Maximum of 2-penalty notices may be issued for the same child within a rolling 3-years period, so at
  the 3rd or subsequent offence another course of action will need to be considered such a prosecution
  or one of the other attendance legal interventions.





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
