This will be my first Halsall and Lydiate Easter and after a roller coaster year it seems to me the message of Easter is more important and more profound than ever. If these last few years has shown us anything it has shown the stark reality that Easter Day cannot be separated from the uncertainty and anguish of Holy Week, no matter how hard we try.

It is right that we celebrate the amazing achievements of so many people who work to build up our communities, keep us safe and ensure all are able to flourish. But we must not forget or dismiss the struggles of those for whom the current pressures mean they are constantly questioning how they will survive another day. Nor should we forget the tragic deaths of so many in war and natural disasters or the ongoing impact of COVID on the world's economy and the associated suffering being endured by so many as a consequence.

The Christian faith is not simply one of deepest despair at sin and the horror of what it does in human lives, nor is it only a constant celebration of God's love and saving power. It embraces both. Jesus' death without his resurrection is simply another tragic and untimely death. Equally, resurrection without recognising the cost paid by Jesus in both the manner of his death and its reality diminishes the profound and unique sacrifice made by God in order to restore our relationship with Him. It is an amazing if profoundly disturbing claim. Why not join us at one of our services over the coming month and ponder what it means for you and your family?
