<u>English</u>

In this unit, students will explore the fascinating topic of the Loch Ness Monster, learning how to create an informative text. We'll read The True Story of the Loch Ness Monster by Francis Gilbert, which will provide an engaging introduction to the topic.

year!


Ukulele will continue to be taught on Thursday mornings after registration.
