English

In this unit, students will explore the fascinating topic of the Loch Ness Monster, learning how to create an informative text. We'll read *The True Story of the Loch Ness Monster* by Francis Gilbert, which will provide an engaging introduction to the topic.

Mathematics

We are excited to have Miss. Gibson joining us full-time this year!

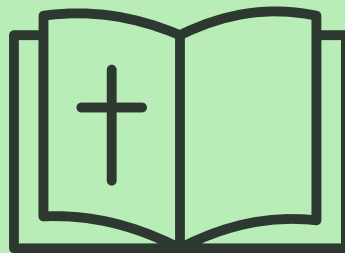
Ukulele will continue to be taught on Thursday mornings after registration.

Religious Education

This term, pupils will explore the importance and purpose of rules from a Christian perspective, reflecting on how these rules guide our actions and relationships. They will examine Christian teachings on living a faithful life and the source of these teachings in Scripture. Students will also reflect on their own lifestyles and the influences shaping their choices, while considering the rules and values followed by other faiths and how they guide behavior in different cultures.



Science

Throughout the term, students will delve into the exciting world of rocks and fossils. They will take on the role of being a palaeontologist and explore different rock types, how fossils are formed and classifying soil. It's going to be an exciting adventure into the natural world!

History

In History, students will explore the leadership structure of the Roman Empire and learn how power was exercised within it. They will investigate the consequences of Boudicca's resistance to the Romans and understand the lasting impacts of Roman rule in Britain, particularly shaped by her actions.
