#### A Servant King

The Coronation of King Charles 111 is a historic occasion in the life of our nation and indeed our churches. The Coronation will take place on 6<sup>th</sup> May at Westminster Abbey and the Archbishop of Canterbury has asked all the churches to pray for The King, The Queen Consort and the Royal Family and for their calling to a life of public service. Following in his mother's footsteps, King Charles' leadership is rooted in a desire and a commitment to serve following the ways of Christ in joy-filled servant-heartedness. A commitment and a desire to follow the teachings of our Lord Jesus who tells us in Matthew 20. 26-28:

"Whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; Just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

This commitment to serve already shown in the Kings' service to the Commonwealth and Nation will become even more intense as his reign continues and so we pray for The King as he strives to model his Kingship by taking as his example, The Servant King our Saviour Jesus Christ. The one who calls not only King Charles but each of us to serve him and each other in the spirit of love.

A prayer for the King and for each of us, as we are all called to serve our God.

Sovereign God, who called King Charles to be a ruler among his people: give him grace to be their servant; and help us, following our Saviour Christ in the path of humble service, to see God's Kingdom set forth on earth and to enjoy its fullness in heaven; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
