

PUPIL PREMIUM 2020/21

In 2011-2012 the Government launched a new funding stream - Pupil Premium Funding. This funding is allocated to initiatives to ensure all pupils reach their potential. At Downholland Haskayne CE Primary School we have a very good record of ensuring that all children make good progress, but historically levels of attainment can be lower for some children who are entitled to pupil premium funding – this is a national trend.

Pupils entitled to Pupil Premium are: Looked After Children, Registered for Free School Meals (FSM) Children of parents in the “forces” (Service Personnel)

In the academic year 2020 – 21 the school has received £12,105 in Pupil Premium Funding. We had 13 (38.24%) pupils attending school (including ever 6) who are entitled to support using this funding. The funding is spent as follows:

Strategy aims for disadvantaged pupils
