# PUPIL PREMIUM

In 2011-2012 the Government launched a new funding stream - Pupil Premium Funding. This funding is allocated to initiatives to ensure all pupils reach their potential. At Downholland Haskayne CE Primary School, we have an excellent record of ensuring that all children make good progress. Still, historically levels of attainment can be lower for some children who are entitled to pupil premium funding – this is a national trend.

Pupils entitled to Pupil Premium are: Looked After Children, Registered for Free School Meals (FSM) Children of parents in the "forces" (Service Personnel)

In the academic year 2019 - 20, the school received £11,880 in Pupil Premium Funding. We had nine pupils attending school (including ever 6) who were entitled to support using this funding. The funding was spent as follows:

Additional Staffing: Improve oral language and maths skills for pupils eligible for PP in Key Stage 1. Increased attendance rates for pupils eligible for PP.

Additional Resources: Additional resources will be purchased to support personalised reading, writing and mathematics programmes. This will include resources to support reading at home. Resources will also be purchased to support all aspects of emotional well-being. Also, further resources to support our computing curriculum will be bought to ensure children have access to the most up-to-date and relevant technology available.

**Educational Visits and other Curriculum Related Activities:** Enriched experiences offered to all children, focused participation in residential trip for KS2, and ensuring attendance on school excursions.

# Pupil Premium Strategy 2020-2021

In the academic year, 2020 - 2021 the school will receive approximately £ 11,880 in Pupil Premium Funding. We currently have nine children on roll who qualify for support using this funding. Our strategy for the use of our pupil premium funding for the coming academic year is outlined below. The strategy is reviewed annually when individual pupil assessment data is collected and analysed in more detail.

# How we plan to use the funding:

Additional Staffing and Training - to enable children to make accelerated progress in their learning through the provision of additional high-quality support.

This year particular emphasis will be given to targeted support programmes to improve attainment in maths. This will be in the form of both individualised and small group support programmes delivered both within and beyond the school day.

Further targeted support to improve attainment in writing, grammar punctuation and spelling and reading will be planned for specific groups of children as required. On-going training will be provided for relevant staff to support and develop classroom practice.

In addition, there will be a continued focus given to home school support to improve attendance, behaviour and support home learning. This will include homework support as required. Trained staff will also continue to aid children in their emotional well-being through our Listening and Support service.

**Additional Resources** - to enhance the range of learning experiences offered to children both within and beyond the school day and to support families with day to day resources needed for school e.g. uniform, snacks.
