Learning Round-Up

Reception

Reception have learned the sound S, A, T and P this week – look out for their sound books coming home and do try to practice. They have enjoyed learning and re-telling the story of Mr Wiggle and Mr Waggle, who went 'up the hill and down the hill...'. They are learning some lovely story language which we will build on throughout their time at Downs Infants. They have also been ordering 'naughty numbers' and enjoying physical Friday.

Year 1

Year 1 have been counting backwards, learning about 1 more and 1 less. They have been grouping animals according to their categories: amphibian, reptile, mammal and so on. They have been learning about our local area in geography and are preparing to go on their first year 1 trip: a local walk.

Year 2 had a terrible experience! The handwriting pens all quit!! This provided the context for some amazing writing based on The Day the Crayons Quit (some of it in pencil!). In maths they are looking at fact families. In history they have been starting to look at the history of transport.
