### Year 1 (Local area fieldwork)

#### Important Ideas:

- use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment
- use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key

- To talk about features of our known immediate environment and how environments like space or different planets might vary from one to another.
- To create and follow maps for a bear hunt in Reception.

#### Key Tier 2 Vocabulary:

<b>Map</b>	A representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads, etc.
<b>Home</b>	the place where we live permanently
<b>Directions</b>	a course along which someone or something moves.
<b>Features</b>	a distinctive attribute or aspect of something.
<b>Route</b>	a way or course taken in getting from a starting point to a destination.

#### Key Tier 3 Vocabulary:

<b>Local area</b>	Relating or restricted to a particular area or one's neighbourhood
<b>Brighton</b>	Brighton is a seaside resort and one of the two main areas of the City of Brighton and Hove.
<b>England</b>	England is a country that is part of the United Kingdom. It shares land borders with Wales to its west and Scotland to its north
<b>United Kingdom</b>	The United Kingdom, made up of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, is an island nation in northwestern Europe.
<b>Locate</b>	Discover the exact place or position of.
<b>Human and Physical features</b>	Human and physical features are things that you can see all around you. Physical features like seas, mountains and rivers are natural.
<b>Key</b>	A key is a list of symbols that appear on the map.
